# COUNCILS & OFFICE BEARERS

WICCI is driven by a strong and growing network of 18,000+ office bearers across 300+ sectors and 1,500+ councils in India and internationally. This diverse and expansive ecosystem brings together women leaders from industry, entrepreneurship, government, academia, policy, and civil society, creating a unified platform for collaboration, leadership, and impact.

WICCI Councils are thoughtfully designed to integrate thought leadership, sectoral expertise, diversity, representation, and grassroots insights. By encouraging cross-sector dialogue and knowledge exchange, the Councils help identify challenges, propose innovative solutions, and support inclusive and sustainable development. The structure enables local, national, and global perspectives to converge, strengthening the quality and relevance of policy advocacy.

Office Bearers serve in honorary leadership roles, including Presidents, Vice Presidents, and Council Members, across various council categories as outlined in the Organisational Structure. These leaders play an active role in shaping agendas, mentoring members, facilitating dialogue, and driving council-led initiatives. Their collective efforts ensure that diverse voices are represented and that meaningful outcomes are achieved.

All WICCI Councils work collaboratively to develop policy recommendations and submit them periodically to relevant government bodies, institutions, and stakeholders. Through research, consultation, and engagement, WICCI contributes to nation-building efforts and global conversations on women's leadership, economic participation, and inclusive growth.

# WICCI Organisational Structure National Boards

WICCI functions through a unique, interwoven, inter-disciplinary and cross-sectional council structure that offers both depth and width of knowledge, enterprise and leadership. This flexible and resilient model allows thought leadership, talent, diversity, representation and grassroots experience to emerge from all sectors of society. Together, these multi-layered councils shape policy recommendations, drive mindset change and contribute to women's economic empowerment and societal transformation.

WICCI works through manifold Councils at National, Regional, State, City and Bilateral/Multilateral levels, covering a wide range of sectors and verticals. Supported by three apex National Boards—Advisory, He-for-She Advisory (Denim Club) and Executive—the councils continually propose concrete steps and recommendations to strengthen women-owned businesses and leadership.

All councils prepare and submit policy recommendations for government and authorities. Councils also act as powerful networks, support systems and platforms for collaboration, enabling women to grow their businesses, careers and leadership capacity.

## National Boards

WICCI has 3 National Boards, with the DG, WICCI serving as Member Secretary in all.

### 1. National Advisory Board

Provides thought leadership, vision and policy guidance to National Sector Councils. It includes invited industry icons and leaders who mentor councils to support the national agenda for women's empowerment and India's economic growth.

### 2. National He-for-She Advisory Board (Denim Club)

# WICCI Organisational Structure National Boards

Comprises male allies—CEOs, entrepreneurs, business leaders and policymakers—who champion gender equity. As global He-for-She champions, they advocate for removing barriers to women's representation and leadership.

## 3. National Executive Board

Includes ex-officio Presidents of all WICCI Councils at National, Regional, State, City and Bilateral/Multilateral levels, along with their Denim Club Partners.

## Council Categories

### 1. National Sector Councils

There are National Sector Councils across 500 sectors and domains, each comprising:

President, Denim Club Partner, Vice-President, 20+ Council Members and Advisory Members (Denim Club).

These councils offer leadership and sector-specific policy recommendations at the national level.

### 2. Regional Councils

(North, South, East, West)

Regional Councils are Coordinating Councils that link and support all councils in their respective geographic areas. Each includes:

President, Denim Club Partner, Vice-President, 20+ members and Advisory Members.

The regions cover all Indian States/UTs distributed across Eastern, Western, Northern and Southern zones.

# WICCI Organisational Structure National Boards

## 3. State Councils

### There are two types:

A. State/UT Coordinating Councils – Coordinate all State Sector Councils and recommend new councils.

B. State/UT Sector Councils – Formed by National Sector Councils and are sector specific.

Each State Council includes: President, Denim Club Partner, Vice-President, 20+ members and Advisors.

## 4. City Councils

### Two types:

A. City Coordinating Councils – Coordinate all City Sector Councils in each city.

B. City Sector Councils – Sector-specific, formed by the State Sector Councils.

Each City Council includes: President, Denim Club Partner, Vice-President, 20+ members and Advisors.

## 5. Bilateral / Multilateral Business Councils

WICCI has councils with 150+ countries to build global business exchange and international collaboration.

Each includes: President, Denim Club Partner, Vice-President, 20+ members and Advisors.

For every country, there are counterpart councils in both nations—for example, UK-India Business Council (UK) and India-UK Business Council (India)—working together to strengthen international business corridors.

# Role of the President, Vice President & Council

The President leads the Council by building a strong team with a Vice President, one Denim Club Partner (He-for-She male ally), and 20+ women members from relevant sectors. The President guides the council's vision, ensures meaningful activities, and drives recommendations to ministries and authorities for policy and structural reforms supporting women's empowerment.

The Denim Club comprises global male allies who support the Chamber's mission of gender equality, inclusion, and collective leadership.

## Core Responsibilities of a Council

Build and lead a collaborative team representing diverse expertise.

Prepare and submit recommendations to ministries, departments, and authorities.

Create the Council Document with profiles of all members and share with WICCI Secretariat.

Plan annual activities such as conferences, summits, trainings, surveys, exhibitions, and policy dialogues.

Strengthen partnerships with ministries, corporates, chambers, universities, institutions, and media.

Publish and promote council initiatives on social media and press platforms.

Sign MOUs for general cooperation with Chambers, Ministries & Corporate CSR (as applicable).

Organise council-level WICCI Awards events and cross-council collaborations.

# Role of the President, Vice President & Council

Promote women entrepreneurs through SHEconomy (Free e-commerce platform).

Leadership Across Council Categories

## **National Sector Presidents**

Nominate leaders for State Sector Councils across India's 36 States & UTs.

## **Regional Presidents (North, South, East, West)**

Nominate State & City Presidents across sectoral and coordinating councils in their region.

## **State/UT Coordinating Presidents**

Guide State-level activities and nominate city leaders.

## **State/UT Sector Presidents**

Lead sector-specific councils at State level and nominate City Sector Presidents.

## **City Coordinating Presidents**

Strengthen citywide collaborations and nominate local council leaders.

## **City Sector Presidents**

Lead specific sector councils within cities and expand membership.

## **Bilateral / Multilateral Presidents**

Promote business exchanges between two countries, connect women entrepreneurs globally, invite cross-border corporate leaders, and organise Bilateral Summits for Women.

## **Distributed Leadership Model**

WICCI follows a collaborative and voluntary leadership model that encourages shared responsibility, wider participation, and creativity.

# CODE OF CONDUCT

WICCI is a sacred, loving space of sisterhood built on compassion, unity, and respect. We remain non-political, non-religious, and non-dogmatic, creating a peaceful environment for all women across cultures and backgrounds.

All members are custodians of this safe space. We keep discussions free from conflict, judgment, or negativity, and uphold our She-for-She spirit of support and empowerment.

## Key Guidelines:

1. Maintain this as a peaceful, inclusive sisterhood without religion, politics, dogma, or negativity.
2. Councils do not make statements on geopolitical issues or visa matters.
3. One Person–One Post: Members must hold only one WICCI council role.
4. Use only official WICCI titles and avoid creating new ones.
5. Councils cannot endorse external awards.
6. No fundraising, fees, or sponsorships under the WICCI name. Event partners may manage costs.
7. Do not seek donations through WICCI platforms.
8. Proceeds from community livelihood initiatives must go directly to beneficiaries.
9. Award nominations must be pre-approved as per WICCI guidelines.
10. Personal company logos discouraged unless supporting the event.

# CODE OF CONDUCT

11. Social media must be through official council handles, for WICCI-related content only.
12. WICCI logo must include the specific council name and be placed prominently.
13. Including family or employees in a council requires prior approval.
14. Admin access for council pages must be shared with the Secretariat.
15. Projects funded by government/corporates need Secretariat approval.
16. Partnerships must align with council mandate and benefit women.
17. Maintain mutual respect; resolve internal issues amicably. Zero tolerance for disputes or defamatory communication.
18. Policy recommendations must be sent only by Council Presidents and copied to the Secretariat.
19. In case of violations, office bearers may be replaced or may resign.

# COUNCIL FAQs

**1. In Bilateral / Multilateral Business Councils, which government do we work with?** You can reach out to governments in both countries with specific asks.

**2. Is this policy-focused work?** Yes, influencing Policy is a priority, along with equal emphasis on business-to-business networking and community outreach.

**3. Who are the Councils reporting to?** Councils are flexibly structured with freedom for self-determination. Working with trust and togetherness, Councils are led by Council Presidents, and their set up is coordinated by WICCI Secretariat/Headquarters.

**4. How does a Council evolve its Roadmap?** Simply follow the given process of setting up a Council- wherein Council President nominates 1 VP and minimum 20 women leaders as Council Members. Initiate exchange and interaction with all with spirit of participatory leadership to evolve your own unique roadmap.

**5. Where does funding come for a council's activities?** Unlike other associations that charge hefty membership fee, WICCI does not charge any of its members. Therefore, it expects each council to fund its own activities via its members/their companies. This is in line with our ethos of participatory/distributed leadership. Expenses of WICCI Secretariat headquarters are funded by the Founder President.

**6. Do all activities of the council need to be 'not for profit'?** Yes, Not-for-profit. If you have a surplus, it is to be used for general good of society.

**7. Are all activities supposed to be business and trade oriented?** Yes. Activities such as research, mentoring, training, knowledge sharing are also included.

# COUNCIL FAQs

**8. How do we build B2B connections through WICCI Councils?** Best way is for your Council / select Councils together to organise Conferences with an inclusive B2B agenda and program having diverse topics and speaking opportunities for women worldwide to share about their work and what they seek as business collaborations. We send circulars to our councils/share on social media to register and join. This brings all stakeholders together for collective energy and synergy.

**9. Can the Councils Abroad be registered in their respective countries?** Councils are informal groups under our parent NGO in India. However for Bilateral Business Councils based Abroad, these are allowed to be registered in their respective countries as NGOs and Non-profit entity to receive and spend local funds/sponsorships in pursuance of the WICCI mandate of women empowerment. Please inform the WICCI Secretariat if you'd like to pursue this as we will need to issue a 'No Objection' for using the word WICCI in your locally registered Council entity. Please note that in this case, your registered council will be fully liable and responsible for all its local compliances, rules and regulations.

**10. Can the Councils in India be registered separately?** NO. Councils in India cannot be registered separately in any place, nor can they open or operate any bank accounts. The Central Account at the Secretariat functions as the nodal point for any external project based funding to be received/ disbursed on behalf of the council.

# Funding FAQs:

## **1. How do we raise funds for our council (state/national/other):**

We do not encourage councils to take on projects where major funding is required as this is not the primary mandate of WICCI. The main role of a Chamber is to make recommendations for policy changes and incentives required at both the center and state level. Councils further engage in knowledge sharing, skilling, networking amongst its members toward empowering and expanding their women's businesses and leadership roles.

## **2. Does the central headquarters provide expenses:**

Unlike other associations, which charge hefty membership fee, WICCI does not charge any of its members. Therefore, it expects each council to fund its own activities via its members or their companies. This is in line with our concept of distributed leadership. In other similar associations, the Presidents contribute considerably of their own funds. In any case since meetings are mostly virtual now, the costs are very low. The members can all pitch in. They can also take sponsorships and small donations but all money must be collected in a NGO they nominate. Central office will not get involved in receipt or disbursement of such funds.

## **3. What are the options if a council wants to do CSR projects:**

If the council does want to a large CSR/Government funded project then they need to submit their proposal to head office for approval. If your project is approved by the head office, then the donations/sponsorships/funding will have to come to the One central account. We do not allow any account other than the central account to be opened. No council, either state or national or any other, can have a separate account as finally the head office is responsible for all audits and legal and statutory compliances including GST & income tax returns. We do not allow separate bank accounts as we at headquarters are fully responsible for overall accounts plus all government and statutory compliance and hence have to be very careful of receipt of funds and their proper use its the trustees that are personally liable, not council presidents or members.

# Funding FAQs:

Since the overall responsibility of use of funds vests with the Trustees of WICCI, the use of any funds raised or received has to be closely monitored and audited as all CSR funds must be used for public good and not for personal profit. As a cost, if head office is involved, they will deduct 25% of the funds received towards their expenses of audit, legal and statutory compliances. The 75% can be given to any NGO nominated by the council or for expenses for which vouchers are available and audited. Expenses of the WICCI Secretariat and the headquarters are funded by the Founder President.

If you prefer, you are welcome to ask the corporate/funding body/sponsor to donate to one of the council members NGO and you can do the CSR from there. There is then no deduction. We really do not / do not wish to take any funds at central level, as being a Section 25 company (not for profit company) our accounting and transparency standards are very high, as are our costs of audit etc.

#### **4. Are foreign funds allowed:**

Foreign funding is completely prohibited.

#### **5. Legal Status of WICCI :**

We are a registered under the companies act, GOI, as section 25 company (not for profit) in the name and style of HR WICCI Foundation Ltd. We have 12AB of the income tax for exemption.
