## Hor. Mana Johnei Pann Nu Foundation


Dr. Alana Golmei is the General Secretary of the Northeast Support Centre & Helpline based in New Delhi. It was launched in 2007 with the aim to prevent harassment, discrimination, molestation and abuses meted out to people from Northeast India living in Delhi NCR, particularly women.

A social activist and a lawyer with the spirit of a humanist, Alana has been relentlessly helping and spearheading the cause of women and has received prestigious awards for her work pertaining to human rights and women's rights. Her meaningful efforts have touched many lives directly, and have helped sensitise the authorities regarding the issue. Since then she has been a voice of the unheard, unseen, and unacknowledged.

She founded the Pann Nu Foundation in 2013 at the backdrop of the rising violence against women in today's world in the form of gender-based discriminations, physical and mental abuse, etc. The Foundation is committed to safeguarding and upholding the dignity of women, and striving against all forms of discrimination and crimes against women irrespective of caste, class, race, religion and geographical region.

She is also a present Member of the Monitoring Committee constituted by the Ministry of Home Affairs for the monitoring and redressal of issues/grievances relating to racial discrimination faced by people from the Northeast residing in different parts of the country. Prior to this, she was a Member of the Bezbaruah Committee (2014) constituted by the Ministry of Home Affairs to look into various kinds of concerns of persons hailing from Northeastern states who are living in different parts of the country.





#### Antara Madavane Upaai

Antara Madavane is the co-founder of upaai, a communication design studio with a focus on healthcare and education.

She is a graduate of Srishti Institute of Art, Design, and Technology, where she received the TATA Trust Scholarship in 2016. Antara was part of a team that designed a system to improve doctor-patient communication at the NIIR Department of NIMHANS, Bengaluru; in 2020, this system, Enhans, was awarded by the Interaction Design Association (IxDA).

She is interested in how design can be used to make our environments more inclusive and sustainable, particularly within an Indian context.

### Indian Rally Driver, Social Rights Supporter

Dr. Baani Yadav is the most experienced and consistent driver with an exceptional track record. She has left a mark in a predominantly male sport with very few women competing, and even fewer winning.

She is India's fastest woman rally racer and is the only Indian woman to win all major Rally Titles in the country in the Women's Category in a year.

While she was exposed to racing early on in her life, she set foot in the professional motor sporting circuit in 2013 and ended up being placed second in the Women's category. She has been breaking and creating records since then and has participated in 32 rallies and won 19 awards.

Her interest in racing stems from her father, who is a mechanical engineer and used to modify cars when she was younger. She dreams to open a Motorsport Driving School in Haryana to further empower the women of the state.

She is an avid supporter of animal rights and has adopted and fostered over 100 animals and pets. She has accelerated various initiatives for acid attack and rape survivors, specially abled persons, women empowerment as well as animal rights and welfare.





# National Council of Applied Economic Research

Bornali Bhandari is a Senior Fellow at the National Council of Applied Economic Research (NCAER) with a background in international economics and macroeconomics, specifically focusing on the impact of globalisation on development.

Currently she is engaged in analysing and assessing the progress and prospects of implementing Direct Benefit Transfers in states and union territories. Her wider research interests include the analysis of skilling from a 3-E perspective (education, employability and employment), infrastructure, particularly the roads and ICT sectors, G-20 issues like climate change financing and reserve currency, FDI and trade-related issues.

Diva is a doctoral candidate at the Blavatnik School of Government at the University of Oxford. She has a Masters in International and Development Economics from Yale University.

## Ministry of Labour and Employment, GOI

Rekha Yadav was appointed as Additional Commissioner in the Employee Provident Fund Organisation, Ministry of Labour & Employment of the Government of India in 2019 and is the former Secretary of the Railway Sports Promotion Board (RSPB).

In her five-year tenure as the Secretary of RSPB, she worked to introduce steps which earned her the goodwill of sportsmen from the non-elite sector. She focused on understanding the needs of the sporting fraternity in Railways and resuscitated the hockey academy in Kapurthala. She constantly interacted with the sportsmen to get an insight into their expectations from their employers.

She ensured that the sportspersons get their desired facilities and increased their diet allowance to Rs. 540 per day which allowed them to stay in peak physical condition for six months. During her time as the Secretary, she also promoted women's sports and is especially proud of our women wrestlers!

One of the truly pathbreaking steps Rekha and her team at RSPB took was the provision of year around special casual leave for the players so that they would not be burdened with official work and concentrate on excelling in their field. They were also able to open the recruitment for women in new disciplines like wrestling, chess, gymnastics, etc.

### Ridhima Phatani Upaai

Ridhima Bhutani is the Co-Founder of Upaai, a communication design & strategy firm. She has a Bachelor's Degree in Information Art & Design Practices from Srishti Institute of Art, Design and Technology.

Ridhima's career in design began with her thesis project at college - a communication system built to help doctors overcome language and literacy barriers while explaining complex medical concepts to their patients. The project was developed along with 7 other designers, and is currently being implemented as a pilot program at NIMHANS in Bangalore. It received global recognition by winning the "Best In Category - Connecting" award at the International Interaction Design Awards held in Milan in 2020.

At present, along with the team at Upaai, she is working in collaboration with NGOs to strengthen their capacity building initiatives. These include, a self learning module aimed at enabling young adults from

Tier 2 cities to make informed career decisions, an "empathy curriculum" designed to sensitise primary schoolers to the lives of differently abled students, and a social media campaign to educate disadvantaged youth on health & sanitation issues.

With a keen interest in Healthcare and Education, Ridhima aims to leverage human centered design to understand communities and reimagine existing practices in an effort to build a more inclusive and connected world.





#### Rita Manchanda Human Rights Activist, Writer

Rita Manchanda is a researcher, writer, lecturer and human rights advocate, specialising in conflicts and peace building in South Asia with particular attention to vulnerable and marginalised groups including women, minorities and forcibly displaced persons.

Her expertise is the intersection of gender studies with peace and security issues within the context of South Asia. She has been influential in shaping the regional Women Peace and Security scholarly and policy discourse and was a member of the UN Women SARO Experts Group on WPS. Her recent writings 'Difficult Encounters with the WPS Agenda in South Asia' (2020) and 'Women's Peacemaking: Issues and Challenges from South Asia' in the OUP Handbook on WPS (2019) reflect her continuing engagement, theoretical and practical, at the national, regional and international level.

She is a Board Member of the 'Women's Regional Network', the 'International Journal of Transitional justice', and Nat Com member of 'Pakistan India Forum for Peace and Democracy', Member WISCOMP and 'Inclusive Security'. She works with multiple women's rights, civil society and social justice groups not only in India but in Nepal, Bangladesh, Sri Lanka and Afghanistan.

Among her many books are two [of the five] volumes in the "SAGE Series in Human Rights Audits of Peace Processes" (Sage:2015), No Nonsense Guide to Minority Rights in South Asia, States in Conflict with their Minorities in South Asia; and articles and chapters including 'Expanding the Middle Space in the Naga Peace Process', (Economic & Political Weekly 2011); and "Contesting Infantalisation of Forced Migrant Women" in Behera edited Gender Conflict and Migration (Sage 2006).

## Ambedkar University, Delhi University

Dr. Shelly Pandey teaches Gender Studies at the School of Human Studies at Ambedkar University, Delhi. Her areas of teaching and research are Gender and Labour, City and Spaces, Middle Classes, Migration and Refugee Studies, Research Methods and Writing, Neoliberalism, Information and Communication Technologies (ICTs) and Society.

She is the recipient of M.N. Srinivas Memorial Award 2012, awarded by the Indian Sociological Society for her paper on 'Private Space in Public Transport: Locating Gender in Delhi Metro' which was published in Economic and Political Weekly.
